

Friday Night – Edison Boat Club Yachts

All Edison Boat Club JAM yachts racing in the JAM class will also be scored separately for EBC Club only Awards. They are also eligible for DRYA Awards. They must fly the EBC burgee on the backstay.

Friday Night – Entries from EBC and DRYA Member Clubs

Anyone who would like to race and is a member of a DRYA member club can join this Regatta. If you do not have a DRYA Certificate you must notify the EBC Race Chair before the race and you will need to fill out the complimentary Provisional Jam Rating Application Form at a minimum of 4 days prior to the race which is available at the DRYA web site, <http://drya.org>. Click on “About the DRYA”, “Forms & Applications”, and select the “2017 PJAM Application Form”. You must follow the instructions on the form.

No new ratings will be issued after Tuesday, August 15 for this Regatta.

Friday Night Sailing Instructions

The 2017 DRYA SPONSORING CLUBS SAILING INSTRUCTIONS 1 - 17 (Sections 10,11,15,16, and course specific instructions are deleted) shall apply for this Regatta as modified herein.

6. CLASS FLAGS is modified to read: Classes will be identified by the following class flags:

7. IDENTIFICATION is modified to provide that only boats in Starts 4 & 6-13 must fly a class flag. JAM start boats must fly the Club Burgee.

8. COURSES & MARKS is modified to read: Marks 'X', and 'Y' are inflated pyramid buoys. All headings are magnetic and distances in NM's are approximate. Course locations are as follows:

Starting Line - N 42° 22.9', W 82° 53.6'
Mark 'X' - N 42° 24.3', W 082° 50.7'
Mark 'Y' - N 42° 25.4', W 082° 51.7'
Finish Line - N 42° 21.24', W 82° 57.41'

The Starting Line Signal Boat shall display a RED FLAG or a GREEN FLAG.

If a RED FLAG is displayed, the course shall be from the Starting Line 2.6NM @ 64° to Mark 'X' rounding it to port. Thence 1.3NM @ 334° to Mark 'Y' rounding it to port then to the finish, line leaving the Peche Island Rear Range Light to port.

If a GREEN FLAG is displayed, the course shall be from the Starting Line 2.9NM @ 37° to Mark 'Y' rounding it to starboard. Thence 1.3NM @ 154° to Mark 'X' rounding it to starboard then to the finish line leaving the Peche Island Rear Range Light to port.

The length for both courses is 10.2NM.

Sailors are reminded about the shallow depth around the Water Intake Crib off CSYC.

9. STARTING is modified to provide that the first Warning Signal will be at 1855 hour.

12. CHANGE OF COURSE BETWEEN STARTS is deleted.

13. CHANGE OF COURSE AFTER ALL STARTS is deleted.

14. TIME LIMITS are modified to read: The time limit for all classes is 4 hours after the starting signal for the first class to start.

17. COURTESY BROADCASTS is modified to state that Courtesy Broadcasts will be made on VHF Channel 72. Boats are requested to monitor VHF channel 72 from one hour before the Warning Signal for the first start until after finishing.

18. COURSE – STARTING AREA is added to state that the starting area will be approximately 300 yards southeast of the Grosse Pointe Club Marina. The Starting Line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Starting Line boat and the water's edge at the course side of an orange inflated pyramid.

19. COURSE – FINISHING AREA is added to state that the Finish Line shall be between the water's edge on the course side of an orange tetrahedron lit with a strobe light and an orange flag flown on the Judge's Stand at Edison Boat Club.

When finishing, all racers shall display a Mac-style luminous number sign on the starboard side of the boat or illuminate their sail numbers.
